After another year of ups and downs it is now clear - gymnastics is back! With 72 clubs and over 41,000 registered members, the much anticipated "return to sport" has been nothing short of remarkable. Throughout the pandemic, we witnessed the true meaning of resilience in our clubs, coaches, judges, volunteers, and participants of all ages and their families. The collective determination to persevere is how we have held together and succeeded in overcoming so many obstacles.

As we reflect on the past year, we celebrate the countless accomplishments within our community. With the relaxation of pandemic-imposed restrictions, the re-opening of many gyms saw a rapid resurgence of interest and participation that quickly filled up recreational and competitive programs alike. A quick pivot from virtual competitions back to in-person was both thrilling and daunting, as clubs and event organizers made every effort to welcome participants and provide the quality experiences which we have come to expect here in BC.

Thank you to all clubs and volunteers who hosted meets and preparation camps throughout the past year. Both the Optional WAG, MAG and Trampoline BC Championships hosted by Flip City and the WAG Compulsory BC Championships hosted by TAG Sports were a resounding success. Top tier gymnastics also returned to the province with the 2022 Canadian Artistic Championships held at the Richmond Olympic Oval and just a week later, Trampoline's Western Canada Cup was held in Port Moody. Both events were jam-packed with talent, delighting the spectators that came out in droves to see BC's best in action. In June, Chimo Gymnastics on Vancouver Island hosted a fabulous BC Gymnaestrada event, with 392 gymnasts and coaches proudly representing 19 groups from 15 clubs throughout the province.

Unfortunately, our recovery has not been without times of disappointment. The cancellation of BC Winter Games in February was keenly felt by many gymnasts throughout the province. A quick adaption and accommodation by Langley Gymnastics Club and the Christy Fraser Memorial Invitational was much appreciated and provided some consolation. Nonetheless, it was welcomed news when the BC Games Society committed to postponing the event to Vernon in 2023. 2021 also brought the tragic loss of two gymnastics facilities in Vernon and Kimberley after senseless acts of arson burnt each facility to the ground.



Thanks to the incredible support of local communities, donors and sponsors, volunteers at both clubs have made tremendous strides towards their rebuilding efforts. North Valley Gymnastics has relocated to a new facility and reopened for business in July 2022. Kimberley Gymnastics Club, with help from the city, the Regional District of East Kootenay and many other donors plans to rebuild and expand their facility's footprint on the same site, in hopes of reopening in summer or fall of 2023.

Throughout the year, GymBC's Board of Directors and staff kept their focus on developing and delivering services and opportunities for member clubs and their communities. Our strategic plan continues to guide our priorities as we start to look past recovery and towards a more robust and dynamic new era for gymnastics in BC. We have worked hard to find resources and funding support for our competitive and recreational programs, safe sport, club operations, events/equipment, coaching education and judge development opportunities.

I am particularly proud of the progress we are making in advancing our Safe Sport initiatives. GymBC is leading a number of projects and committees focused on the many aspects of establishing and maintaining a safe sport environment. From assessing and mitigating risk from external sources such as equipment set-up and maintenance, to safeguarding our athletes and coaches through education and training, GymBC remains steadfast in our commitment to providing a safe sport environment for all participants that is accessible, inclusive and free from all forms of maltreatment.

Finally, I would like to thank both past and present board members and our staff for their many contributions to the ongoing success of our programs, events and services. I would also like to thank all of our clubs for your continued support and trust this past year. It is a privilege to work with all of you as we embark on another fantastic year for gymnastics in BC.

I look forward to seeing and sharing more good news with you at this year's Annual General Meeting at the Hilton Vancouver Hotel, Metrotown in Burnaby on October 23.





2021-22 HIGHLIGHTS

RISK MANAGEMENT SUPPORT

GymBC's Safety Officer visited 20 member clubs to gain a better understanding of current operations and risk management practices.

Additional purposes of these meetings were to support clubs with tools to improve their risk management processes and identify common issues for the development of future tools, templates, and resources for clubs to leverage.

A new electronic reporting system was introduced that is able to identify activities leading to the most common injuries.

COMMUNICATION PLATFORMS

A transition from various platforms to Activity Messenger has helped to streamline the quality and efficiency of GymBC communications and services.

GymBC staff is working towards moving all forms to Activity Messenger.

The 2022 TG Westerns and 2022 BC Gymnaestrada successfully hosted event pages on the site. In the near future, course and event calendars will also be moved to Activity Messenger.

COACH & JUDGE DEVELOPMENT

Coach and judge recruitment, education, and retention has consistently been identified as an area that clubs would like further support in.

Expansion of the previous Coach Education portfolio to a broader Coach and Judge Development role aims to support long-term development and recruitment strategies to increase the number and expertise of coaches and judges in the province.

MEMBERSHIP FEE STRUCTURE WORKING GROUP

In 2021-22, GymBC saw a nearly 50% increase in membership over the previous year, as our sport rebounded from the pandemic. We anticipate continued membership growth into next year.

In early 2022, a Membership Fee Structure Working Group was formed. The group was tasked with exploring options to establish a balanced and equitable approach to setting GymBC annual membership fees, in order to present the GymBC Board of Directors with a recommendation on how to structure and set fees for the future.

Once a fee structure model and recommendations are accepted by the Board, the proposal will be shared with the membership for approval.



- As there was a gap in GFA staff at GymCan, the GFA Council took the lead on the 2021 Gym Week, which ran successfully throughout the country.
- In BC, we ran a parallel contest, which was also well-received. Winners for both the social media and drawing contests were randomly selected.

INTERCLUB

- An Interclub Roundtable with member clubs was held in October 2021. The purpose was to assess the effect of Xcel adoption and determine if further gaps in GFA programming need to be addressed.
- It was determined that Performance Plus would remain as an option for events.

GYMNAESTRADA

- 2022 BC Gymnaestrada: Chimo Gymnastics stepped up and delivered an extraordinary 2022 BC Gymnaestrada event on a condensed timeline - thank you to all the dedicated staff and volunteers! The event took place from June 3-5, 2022 in Comox, BC.
- 2022 Canadian Gymnaestrada: 273 BC participants from 7 GymBC clubs participated in the 2022 Canadian Gymnaestrada. The event was held from June 30 to July 5, 2022 in Edmonton, Alberta.

- GFA held a strategic planning retreat in Whistler from June 20-22.
- The event was held in conjunction with the WAG Planning Retreat.
- 12 GFA committee members and club delegates gathered to work through a detailed two-year roadmap to guide the program.



CANGYM REVITALIZATION PROJECT

- The project was put on hold during a gap in GFA staff at GymCan.
- The revised soft launch for the Active Start module of the program has been postponed until September 2022.

- Jared Goad hired as WAG Provincial Performance Advisor (PPA).

- Clubs hosted a hybrid year with both live and virtual events, with many demonstrating a lot of flexibility by being able to adapt on short notice.





ANAGEMENT

In recent years, risk management has become an essential part of GymBC's operational priorities. In the 2021-2022 season, GymBC continued its commitment to risk management strategies and initiatives.

GymBC's staff focused on providing support for clubs experiencing COVID-19 operational challenges, and increasing more general risk management priorities. The administration of GymBC's insurance program and safe sport initiatives were also priorities.

Outcomes in these areas included GymBC providing its members with leadership, direction, more than 20 in-person club meetings, communication and updates to clubs as well as several webinars/education sessions.

SUPPORTING MEMBER CLUBS THROUGH COVID-19

Varied COVID-19 requirements were imposed by the BC Government and the Provincial Health Officer throughout the 2021-2022 season. These requirements changed a number of times and eventually were reduced to minimal measures in April 2022. GymBC strived to consistently provide its member clubs with information that was as timely and accurate as possible.

INSURANCE COVERAGE

GymBC was successful in obtaining \$10 Million in coverage for its Commercial General Liability policy without increasing membership fees – consistent with the previous year.

This sustained coverage (including trampoline devices) allowed GymBC to reintroduce public access programming (Birthday Parties, Drop-Ins, and Field Trips) following the end of COVID-19 restrictions with new rules to manage the risk of trampoline devices in these settings.

SAFE SPORT

As clubs and Team BC returned to in-person events and practices, GymBC's Safety Officer provided guidance for Team Managers and Chaperones relating to appropriate behavioral management issues during Team BC trips.

Due to increased activities in person, GymBC received an influx of complaints in 2022. GymBC approved its Complaint Management Handbook in early 2021 and the complaint management process has been activated several times since.

Safe Sport education sessions took place with 3 clubs and at multiple other events. Education projects have been started and led by GymBC at the national level. Outcomes from this work on Safe Sport education are expected to be shared in early 2023.











2021 AGM

- The GymBC AGM was held virtually on October 24, 2021.
- 25 voting clubs were in attendance.
- The annual report and audited financial statement for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 were approved.
- Two Member at Large board positions were up for election. Mary Morice and Chantelle Yates were elected into these vacant positions.

2021 VIRTUAL AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIP

- As in-person events were restricted at the time, the 2021 event was presented as a video to our members on February 25, 2022.
- 35 individuals were recognized for their accomplishments during the 2020-21 season.
- Two awards were issued for Outstanding Achievements to Sam Smith and Curt DeWolff for their participation in the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games.
- Three scholarships were awarded to: Maja Bonham, Meaghan Kujat, and Natalie Anderson
- Todd Sader, Jade Kotzer and Ford White were presented with GymBC Member of Distinction awards.
- Toni Vance and Ford White were presented with GymBC Life Member awards.

2022 TG BC CHAMPIONSHIPS


- The TG BC Champs took place on March 25-27, 2022 at the North Surrey Sport & Ice Complex in Surrey, BC.
